Australian Horse and Rider Trophy for highest scoring team of 5 riders from 1 club.

Madge Birrell Trophy for highest point scores in Troop Drill combined with points for certificates.

General

- Pony Club rules apply: 1 horse 1 rider
- For Showriding, double bridles & pelhams that are accepted at Zone & State level will be permitted in all classes except Pleasure Hack and Pony Club Mount where snaffle bits must be worn. All Pony Club approved bits are acceptable for all other phases.
- For Novice & Beginner rings, any Pony Club approved bit with a single rein is acceptable ie pelhams are to have rounded splitters.
- All riders are to make sure their horse's water bucket holds a minimum of 20L.
- In the case of a tie for Championships points a combination or show rider class, bending and equitation points will be added together as the decider
- Non- Championship Classes (Beginner & Novice) do not accrue points towards Trophies. In these classes, a Highest Point score & Runner Up sash will be awarded.

Stockman's Challenge

In addition to the highly successful Brumby Challenge, a stockmans challenge will also be incorporated into this year's Jamboree. Whilst the Brumby Challenge focuses on the horses' skills and courage, the brumby challenge will see riders take on challenges such as opening gates, negotiating obstacles and showing off their agility.

Horsemanship

A horsemanship event will be held over the 2 days of competition. For this event, age appropriate activities that *could* include; rein drill, saddling / unsaddling, floating, general horse knowledge questions etc will be judged.

Novelty events

For those riders with some energy left in the tank, a series of novelty races (egg & spoon, sack, and 3 legged races) will see the all ages compete for novelty race supremacy. This will be weather and time dependant.

2018 Jamboree Program Novice & Beginner

Trot only – no canter

Novice - Walk trot only – minimal assistance with mounting etc as required

Assisted Beginner – can be accompanied but attempts all tasks on their own

Led Beginner - Assisted – led

Note: classes may be combined

Hacking:

- Best Presented (mounted)
- Handler (saddle on stirrups up)
- Rider
- Best Hands
- Pleasure Mount
- Pony Club Mount (bending poles, mugs, flags, ground poles, jacket on barrels etc may be used)
- Most suitable combination

Sporting:

- Keyhole * Running T
- Bending * Barrels
- Bonfield Bounce (no barrels)
- 5 flag * 3 mug
- Square yard
- Brumby Challenge
- Stockman's Challenge



Show jumping:

- AM7 poles on ground
- Equitation poles on the ground

Brumby Challenge: as per open

Stockmans Challenge: as per open

Horsemanship: appropriate for age



Note:

- Classes will be split in age groups & ability level according to entries.
- Canter will result in elimination
